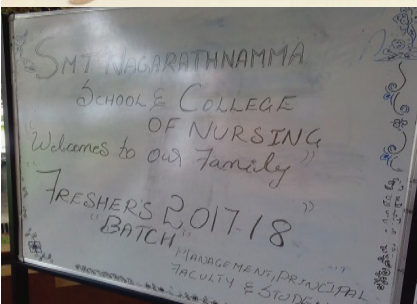
10 DAY - INDUCTION PROGRAMME for the fresher's batch of 2017-18 01.9.17 to 15.9.17

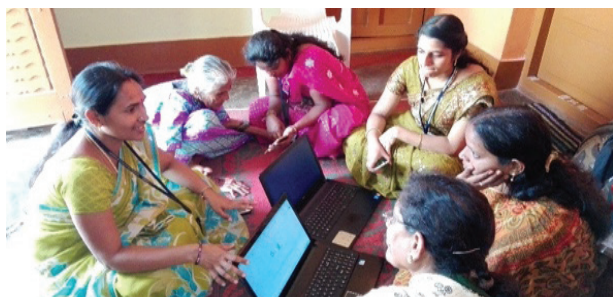
INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY -2017 BY NSS & WOMEN CELL

Theme: Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS)

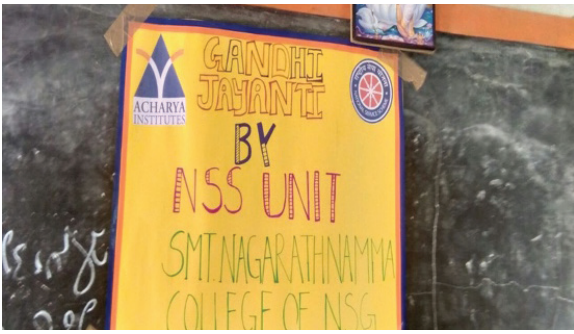

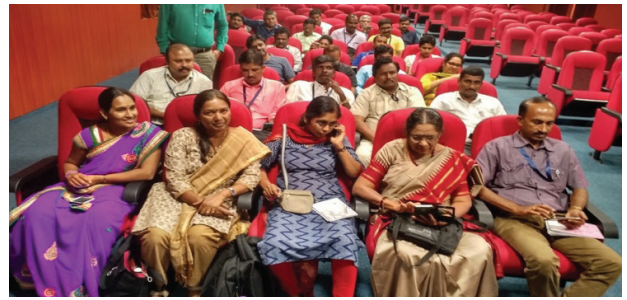


Life Skills Training- from 12th to 18th November 2017

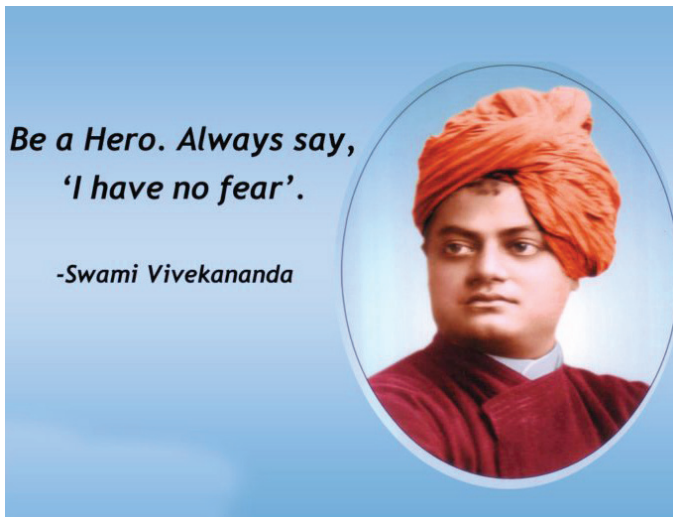
School Health Programme Report

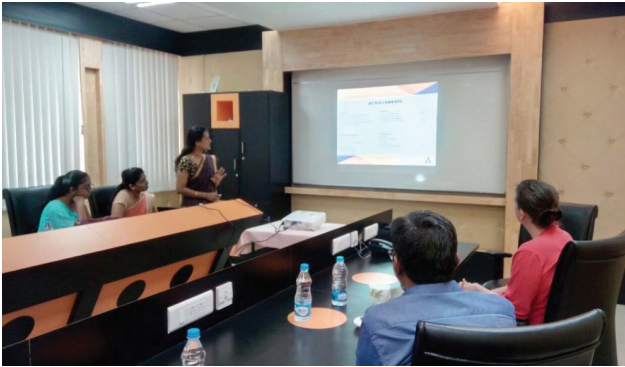
“Branding”

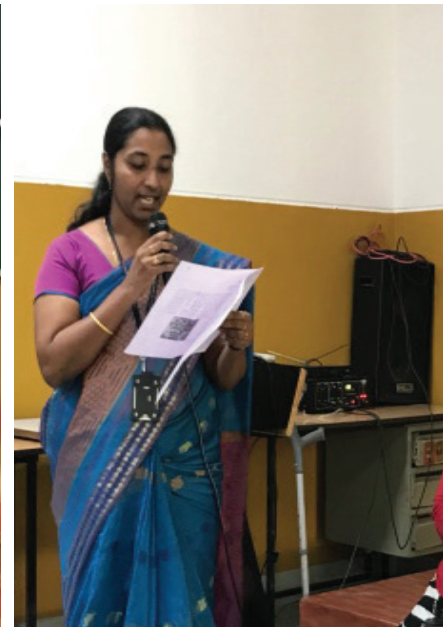

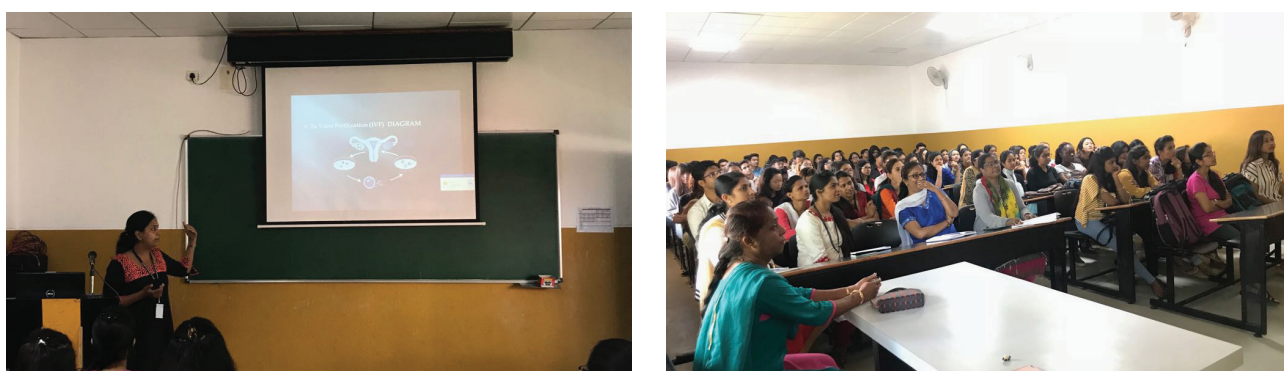
PEDIATRIC DEPARTMENTAL SEMINAR

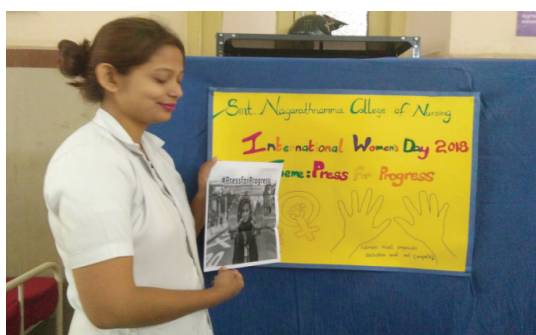
