- 4 Explain with sketches the concepts of "circulation" and "built form to open space relationships" in the process of site planning and design. Explain with sketches. (20 Marks)

- 5 Describe the role of water in landscape. Elaborate with suitable diagrams on any 5 aspects. (20 Marks)

OR

- 6 Explain in detail any 5 design considerations for the below in a public park:  
(i) Street furniture. (10 Marks)  
(ii) Outdoor shading structures. (10 Marks)

- 7 Give a short description of the "English romantic gardens" with atleast one example. Illustrate with sketches wherever required. (20 Marks)

- 8 Give an understanding of the design philosophies, background and works of any two landscape practices:  
(i) Turenscape. (ii) Shaheer Associates. (20 Marks)  
(iii) Maya Lin. (iv) Ravindra Bhan

### Module-5

- 9 Describe your approach to be considered in a landscape design for a fine arts campus. Elaborate using sketches. (20 Marks)

OR

- 10 Write a short note on any five design and planning aspects to be considered while designing a campus on a "moderate to highly contours". Assume hypothetical site and explain. (20 Marks)
