- 8 Explain the works and contributions of Martha Schwartz in contemporary landscape architecture. Discuss case examples. (20 Marks)

Module-5

- 9 Chalk down your approach (Design considerations) for a landscape design of a small scale eatery outlet / cafe. Illustrate with neat sketches. (20 Marks)

OR

- 10 Analyze and assess any one Live / Proposed project which has come up in Indian context for a lake front or a river front development. (20 Marks)
